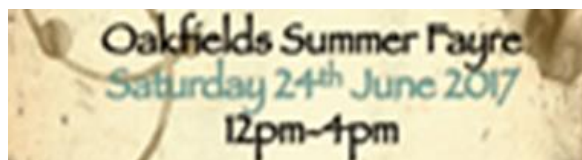

We would very much like to offer our congratulations to Miss Berry and Miss Kitt who have both recently passed their PGCE courses with flying colours and we are lucky to have

retained them as NQT's (newly qualified teachers) in September. Alongside her ICT teaching, Miss Kitt will be an additional teacher in Year 3. Additionally, we are currently looking to recruit a Teaching Assistant for the Year 5/6 classes.

Furthermore, we're sure you will have noticed the absence of Mrs Day's name from the above. Mrs Day has decided to become a full-time mum and will not be returning to Oakfields. We fully respect this decision and wish her and baby George all the very best for the future. Mrs Marshall, who covered Mrs Day's maternity leave, will continue to teach Year 4 in September, joined by Miss Berry, as this will be a two-class year group next year.

In addition to their Year 5 class duties, Mrs Spreckley and Mrs Wagner will, along with Mrs Carroll and Miss Berry form the 11+ teaching team going forward. Both Mrs Spreckley and Mrs Wagner are experienced Year 6 teachers, and have prepared children for Level 6 SATs papers, which are on an academic level with the 11+ tests, so they are well equipped for the rigours of Year 5. Mrs Spreckley has already started to join the 11+ Maths sessions and is familiar to the children and Mrs Wagner – who will teach the English - has had first-hand experience of 11+ examinations and the Independent school route. They are both very excited and enthusiastic about taking on this role. Mrs Carroll will take responsibility for preparing children for interview and continuing to develop our close links with state, grammar and Independent Schools. For children entering Year 6, the 11+ sessions will continue until January 2018 when the last of the Independent School entrance examinations will have finished.



All children, including September joiners, will have the opportunity to meet their new class teacher during 'Meet the Teacher' day on Tuesday 11 July 9 a.m. – 10.30 a.m. (the new intake will stay until lunchtime). As last year, parents will have the chance to meet their child's new teachers in the first full week back at school in September.

This leads nicely on to Prize Giving which takes place on Saturday 8 July at Coopers' Company and Coborn School (St. Mary's Lane, Upminster, RM14 3HS). To ensure a prompt 10 a.m. start, the children should arrive from 9.30 a.m. when they are asked to join their teachers in the Sports Hall with doors opening to parents at 9.45 a.m. All children will have a chance to perform and there will be a couple of musical interludes to 'whet your appetite' ahead of the announcement of this year's stand out performers and our leaders for the next academic year – Head Boy and Head Girl, Sports Captains, House Captains, Prefects. Likewise, school council members from Years 3- 6 will be announced, along with Librarians and Digital Leaders. This way, we will really hit the ground running and be ready for action in September. The long-awaited ESB Certificates will also be formally presented.

To ensure the comfort and safety of everybody and to meet capacity guidelines this year, we unfortunately have to limit the number of guests @ two per family. We will therefore be issuing complimentary tickets to the children in the week prior to Prize Giving to ensure that all families are able to attend this mandatory event. **Please ensure that these are brought with you on the day as this will speed up our procedures.**

- Summer uniform (without cardigans and jumpers please)
- Simple hair styles – although girls should have their hair tied back neatly, without any large hair accessories;
- Shiny shoes;

Should we be subjected to a heatwave that day, we will naturally allow all of the children to remove their blazers accordingly. We are certain that a good morning will be had by all.

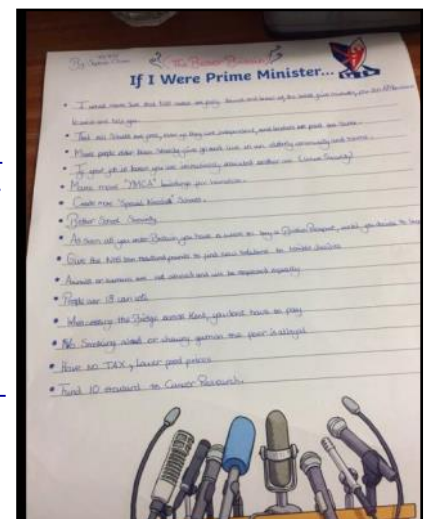
